Established in 2009 as a "museum of the streets" by the legendary Tony Goldman with co-curator Jeffrey Deitch, Wynwood Walls has become a phenomenon, spurring the creation of murals throughout the Wynwood district. It is now one of the premiere venues in the world to see the work of leading street artists.

The world-class murals and the spirit of the project


at-

tract hundreds of thousands of people to Wynwood Walls each year, and it has become an iconic cultural destination.

In 2010, the adjacent Wynwood Doors, with 176 feet of roll-up storefront gates was added. Each subsequent year, a selection of international artists – that range from old school graffiti legends to young up and coming talents – have created artwork for Wynwood Walls. In 2012, Wynwood Walls celebrated Art Basel with a series of events dedicated to the vision of Tony

Goldman,

who passed that September. Since that time, the project has been curated by Tony's daughter, Goldman Properties CEO Jessica Goldman Srebnick. In 2013, Jeffrey Deitch, who was the original curatorial advisor, returned to co-curate Women on the Walls, a project and gallery exhibition celebrating the contributions of outstanding women artists who are part of the history and the new energy of street art. Women on the Walls incorporated nine new murals showcasing the work of essential innovators, such as Lady Pink, as well as artists who are redefining street art today from a woman's perspective, including Maya Hayuk and Miss Van.



Since the first year's program featuring Kenny Scharf, Futura, Os Gemeos, Swoon, Shepard Fairey, and other renowned innovators in street art - Miami's now world-renowned open air museum continues to attract visitors from across the globe. The outdoor "museum" of international street art currently showcases cutting-edge murals created by 42 respected street artists from Asia, Europe, Latin America and the United States. Encompassing a total of 50 dazzling works, Wynwood Walls includes 18 murals exhibited within the walls themselves, 14 adjacent Wynwood Door murals and 18 art pieces featured outside of the walls.
